Masters Graduands:



HONORARY DEGREE

Professor Loizos G. Loizou

Professor Loizou received his MD degree from the Université Libre de Bruxelles, Belgium, in 1984. In 1986, he obtained a postgraduate diploma in preventative paediatrics from the University Louis Pasteur, Strasbourg, France. Subsequently, in 1989, he completed his specialty training in paediatrics and paediatric oncology at the University of Nancy, France.

Upon his return to Cyprus in 1989, Professor Loizou embarked on the establishment of the Paediatric Oncology/Haematology Department at the Archbishop Makarios III Hospital, encompassing both clinical and laboratory services. He served the post of Department Director until his retirement in November 2021. During his tenure, Professor Loizou pioneered several ground-breaking initiatives, including the creation of the first child and adolescent cancer registry in Cyprus, the establishment of a laboratory for leukaemia and other bone marrow diseases, the inception of the first bank for the cryopreservation of cord blood stem cells, and the leadership of the team responsible for the first-ever bone marrow transplantation in Cyprus.

From 1990 to 2021, Professor Loizou held the position of President of the Committee of the Cyprus Ministry of Health for the referral of children and adolescents with haematological, oncological, and immunological diseases for treatment abroad. He represented Cyprus in various European Union initiatives, such as the 'Europe Against Cancer' programme and the 'loint Action for Rare Cancers'. Additionally, he served as the Cyprus National Representative to the Clinical Research Committee of the International Society of Paediatric Oncology, Europe. In 1990, Professor Loizou founded the ELPIDA foundation, a non-for-profit, nongovernmental organization dedicated to supporting children and adolescents with cancer, and has served as its president since its inception.

Professor Loizou has received honours awards from the Cyprus Association of Paediatricians (2021), the Cyprus State Health Services Organization of the Ministry of Health (2022), and the American Hellenic Education and Progressive Association (2022). In January 2023, he was bestowed the prestigious title of 'Chevalier' in the National Order of Merit by the President of the French Republic, one of France's highest distinctions.

In addition to his clinical and social contributions, Professor Loizou has been an active researcher, publishing papers in peer-reviewed journals. Under his guidance and expertise, Cyprus has achieved remarkable results in paediatric oncology, with over 80% of children and adolescents with all types of cancer being cured, including 83% of those with acute leukaemia and over 95% with lymphomas. These statistics align with those of high-income countries, as recognised by the World Health Organisation, and Professor Loizou's contributions have played a pivotal role in this achievement.

Since 2013, Professor Loizou has held the position of Clinical Professor at the University of Nicosia Medical School, actively engaging in teaching and clinical training of students. Recently, in collaboration with the Medical Association of Cyprus, the Association of Paediatricians of Cyprus, the University of Nicosia Medical School, and the American Hellenic Educational and Progressive Association, Professor Loizou, who is also an avid marathon runner, has organised numerous large-scale events aiming at raising public awareness on matters relevant to health, medicine, and wellbeing.

The Honorary Doctorate bestowed upon Professor Loizou recognises his outstanding and pioneering work in the care of children and adolescents with cancer in Cyprus.



HONORARY DEGREE

Professor Andreas N. Nicolaides

Professor Andreas Nicolaides is one of the pioneers in non-invasive vascular screening, diagnostic investigation, and the early detection and prevention of atherosclerotic cardiovascular and venous diseases. He completed his education at the Pancyprian Gymnasium in Nicosia before moving to the UK to pursue medicine at the Guy's Hospital Medical School. Afterwards, he specialized in vascular surgery, earning fellowships from the Royal Colleges of Surgeons in England and Edinburgh. His research and academic career started very early in his clinical years, and has led him to a successful position as Professor of Vascular Surgery at St Mary's Hospital Medical School, Imperial College London.

Professor Nicolaides has made significant contributions to the medical and vascular surgery society, with his findings incorporated into guidelines that have greatly enhanced early detection of vascular diseases. He has developed the sequential compression device for surgical patients used in most hospitals world-wide, reducing the incidence of deep vein thrombosis (DVT) by 70%, thereby preventing sudden death and long-term complications from venous thromboembolism. Additionally, by using analysis of carotid plaque images obtained by ultrasound, Professor Nicolaides has demonstrated the possibility of stroke risk stratification in patients with asymptomatic carotid stenosis of over 50%, and that plaque measurements in large arteries provide information on cardiovascular risk over and above conventional risk factors. Furthermore, he introduced the use of duplex velocity ratios to determine the degree of stenosis in an artery or arterial graft. These findings, including data from a Cypriot population cohort, have become foundational in vascular surgery and cardiovascular guidelines.

His current research focuses on genetic and environmental risk factors for cardiovascular diseases, identification of individuals at risk, and the development of effective methods of prevention, particularly stroke.

Undoubtedly, his work has contributed to the prevention of premature deaths, morbidity, and disability from thromboembolic disease, with major impact on individuals, societies, and healthcare systems.

Throughout the years, Professor Nicolaides has maintained his dedication to Cyprus. He serves as the Founder Member and first President of Cyprus Atherosclerosis Society, Chairman of the Cyprus Cardiovascular Disease Educational and Research Trust, and Medical Director of the Vascular Screening and Diagnostic Centres in London and in Cyprus. Since 2014, he has held the position of Honorary Professor of Surgery at the University of Nicosia Medical School and remains a Professor Emeritus at Imperial College. Furthermore, Professor Nicolaides generously donated rare books to the UNIC Health Library to educate students and visitors about significant figures in medical history, including Thomas Sydenham (known as the "English Hippocrates"), Joseph Lister (inventor of antiseptic surgery), and Jean Martin Charcot (referred to as the "Napoleon of Neurosis").

In recognition of his remarkable contributions to cardiovascular medicine worldwide and in Cyprus, we proudly award Professor Andreas Nicolaides with an Honorary Doctorate.

The Peter Kopelman and Andreas Charalambous Founders Prize was initiated last year and is offered on an annual basis following a donation by the late Professor Peter Kopelman and Professor Andreas Charalambous, who worked together in establishing the University of Nicosia Medical School in 2011, as Principal of St George's University of London and Executive Dean of the UNIC Medical School respectively. The prize worth €500 is accompanied by a letter of achievement and is shared by the MD and MBBS graduands who achieved the highest cumulative scores in their programme of study.

The University and the School are grateful to the late Professor Peter Kopelman and Professor Andreas Charalambous for founding a successful Medical School in Cyprus. Their generous donation to acknowledge and reward the achievements of medical students is sincerely appreciated.


The Dr Eleftherios Eleftheriou Memorial Prize in Medical Ethics and Behavioural Sciences



To be recited by the Graduates of the MBBS and MD programmes

I swear to fulfil, to the best of my ability and judgment, this covenant:

I will respect the hard-won scientific gains of those physicians in whose steps I walk, and gladly share such knowledge as is mine with those who are to follow.

I will apply, for the benefit of the sick, all measures [that] are required, avoiding those twin traps of overtreatment and therapeutic nihilism.

I will remember that there is art to medicine as well as science, and that warmth, sympathy, and understanding may outweigh the surgeon's knife or the chemist's drug.

I will not be ashamed to say "I know not," nor will I fail to call in my colleagues when the skills of another are needed for a patient's recovery.

I will respect the privacy of my patients, for their problems are not disclosed to me that the world may know. Most especially must I tread with care in matters of life and death.

I will remember that I do not treat a fever chart, a cancerous growth, but a sick human being, whose illness may affect the person's family and economic stability. My responsibility includes these related problems, if I am to care adequately for the sick.

I will prevent disease whenever I can, for prevention is preferable to cure.

I will remember that I remain a member of society, with special obligations to all my fellow human beings, those sound of mind and body as well as the infirm.

If I do not violate this oath, may I enjoy life and art, respected while I live and remembered with affection thereafter. May I always act so as to preserve the finest traditions of my calling and may I long experience the joy of healing those who seek my help.

This is a modern version of the Hippocratic oath written in 1964 by American physician and Professor of Medicine Louis Lasagna.


